STANISLAUS ANIMAL SERVICES AGENCY ACTION AGENDA SUMMARY

SUBJECT:			
Approval to Accept a Donation of \$20,000 from DocuPet and to Appropriate \$5,000 of the Donation for Drive-Thru Microchip Clinics to be held in June 2021 for the Community.			
DISCUSSION:			
DocuPet, the licensing agent, for SASA worked collaboratively with Stanislaus Animal Services Agency to increase revenue gained from gifts. Donation options were interlaced throughout the licensing process allowing licensees to donate whether they were completing their registration online, over the phone, by mail, or in person. In the first year, DocuPet was able to collect \$20,000 in donations from licensees.			
One of the best methods to get a lost dog reunited with an owner is with a microchip. Pet owners are encouraged to microchip their dogs. The microchip has a unique number that provides all the owner information and is one of the first items checked for when a lost dog is found or brought to the shelter. Dogs with a microchip go home to their owner much sooner than a dog without a microchip. Dogs with a microchip can also go home without entering the shelter. If the information is updated on the microchip, the officers are able to call the microchipped owner to return the pet home.			
All dogs adopted or reclaimed from Stanislaus Animal Services Agency are microchipped before leaving the shelter. This is in accordance to county ordinance and city codes.			
The donated amount of \$5,000 will provide 1000 owned dogs a microchip at no cost to the owner. This will be advertised as a special promotion during the month of June 2021. Microchip clinics at no cost to dog owners as the state begins to reopen services to the public.
